For the 13th year in a row, MOAA has been named one of the top lobbyists by The Hill, a news outlet based in Washington, D.C. It is the only military or veterans service organization honored among the 100 winners in the association category for 2019. Some highlights include: helping to secure repeal of the widow's tax; ensuring no new health care access fees for service members and retirees; partnering with other veterans service organizations to pass the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act, and helping ensure a 3.1% active duty pay raise.

GUEST SPEAKER – DAVID "BART" BARTHOLOMEW

David Bartholomew was born October 2, 1933 in Fargo North Dakota and graduated from Moorhead State College High School, MN in 1950. He was awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in agriculture education from North Dakota State University in 1954 and earned a Master of Science degree in electrical engineering from the University of Illinois in 1965.

David was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Air Force Reserve in 1954. He was called to active duty in March 1955 and was assigned to Chanute AFB. Over the next twenty nine plus years he had a variety of increasingly responsible and challenging assignments in the continental US and overseas. During the first 21 years of his Air Force career he was promoted through the ranks and achieved grade of colonel in 1976. David retired from the Air Force e in 1984 and started work at Texas Instruments that same year. He later worked for Raytheon and retired from the company in 2004.

In early 2000's, he was diagnosed with Parkinson's' and became interested in the speech problems of Parkinson's disease and related neurological disorders. A special non-profit group was formed in Dallas, in 2005 under the auspices of the National Parkinson Foundation to help people with related problems. In 2008, the name and mission of the organization was changed to Parkinson Voice Project and he became chairman of the board. He retired in July 2019.

SENATE ADVANCES MENTAL HEALTH BILL

At end of January, the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs held a markup to discuss and advance the S.785, Commander John Scott Hannon Veterans Mental Health Care Improvement Act of 2019, which would improve VA mental health care programs and services for veterans. The bill would also establish two grant programs, one to enable nongovernment entities to provide supportive mental health care services and another to expand telehealth programs such as Project ATLAS. The committee also advanced legislation to improve health care for women veterans, expand transportation grants for veterans who live in rural areas, expand veterans preference for reserve component members, and confirm Judge Grant Jaquith to the Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims. The bills and Judge Jaquith's nomination now await consideration by the full Senate.

TEXAS VETERANS LAND BOARD LOAN INFO

On Thursday, Jan. 23, Texas Land Commissioner George P. Bush announced that Texas Veterans and Military Members are now eligible for **low-interest home loans up to** \$510,400. The new loan limit will take effect on Friday, Jan. 24 for all applications received on or after that date.

In 1983, the Texas Legislature created the <u>VLB Veterans Housing Assistance Program</u>, to aid Texas Veterans in purchasing a home. Eligible Texas Veterans, Military Members, and their spouses can purchase a home with a competitive, low-interest loan with little or no down payment. They can borrow up to \$510,400 on a fixed-rate loan for 15-, 20-, 25- or 30-year term*.

Veterans with a VA service-connected disability rating of 30% or greater qualify for a discounted interest rate. You can check the <u>interest rates in real time</u> on our website.

HISTORY NOTE ON IWO JIMA

U.S. Marines invaded Iwo Jima on Feb. 19, 1945 after months of naval and air bombardments. Japanese soldiers were dug in bunkers deep in the island's volcanic rock. Approximately 70,000 U.S. Marines and 18,000 Japanese soldiers took part in the battle. In 36 days of fighting, nearly 7,000 Marines were killed. Another 20,000 were wounded. Marines captured 218 Japanese soldiers; the rest were killed in action. Twenty-seven Medals of Honor were awarded for the battle.

MEMORIAM – GEORGE BARTON

Colonel George C. Barton passed away peacefully on Saturday, January 18, 2020. He was born March 8, 1932, in Salamanca, New York, to Harry and Maud Barton. During his high school years, he was a member of the track team. He would run cross country for New York State College for Teachers at Buffalo, where he received his bachelor's degree in 1954. Later while also serving in the military, he earned his Master's degree from the University of Southern California in 1978.

He was commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant, received his navigator wings in 1956 and retired from the U.S. Air Force as a Colonel in 12982. His assignments took him many places: Germany, Morocco, Kansas, Texas, Washington, California, Thailand, Guam, Okinawa, and Nebraska, where he and Goldie made homes and met many friends.

His military awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Air Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Armed Services Reserve Medal and the Army Good Conduct Medal.

George was an avid golfer as well as a league bowler. He enjoyed the hands-on automobile restoration of his prized Volkswagen Karmen Gia, and an intellectual passion for family genealogy research.

He was preceded in death by his parents. George is survived by his wife of 63 years, Goldie Barton; daughter, Karen Harrelson and husband, Greg, and grandson, Bradley; son, Brian Barton and wife, Corina; and brother, Howard Barton. Services were held on January 27, 2020 and burial was at the Central Texas State Veterans Cemetery, Killeen.
