MOAA STORMING THE HILL

On March 25, council and chapter leaders from across the U.S. will go to Washington, D.C., to participate in MOAA's annual Storming the Hill advocacy event. Representatives from the Texas Council of Chapters will be part of the team effort.

NEW USAF CHIEF OF STAFF NOMINATION

Gen. Charles Q. Brown Jr., commander of Pacific Air Forces, has been nominated to be the 22nd Chief of Staff of the Air Force, Defense Secretary Mark Esper announced March 2, confirming Air Force Magazine's earlier report. Brown will succeed Gen. David Goldfein, whose tenure ends June 30. If confirmed, Brown would be the first African American to serve as Chief of Staff of any of the U.S. Armed Forces. The only other African American to serve on the Joint Chiefs of Staff was Army Gen. Colin Powell, who was Chairman from 1989-1993.

<u>VA UPDATE ON CAREGIVERS AND AGENT</u> ORGANGE

At the end of February, Secretary of Veterans Affairs Robert Wilkie testified before the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs to discuss the fiscal year 2021 budget request for VA. Committee members asked Wilkie when VA will expand the caregiver program and whether it will add bladder cancer, Parkinsonism, hypertension, and hyperthyroidism to the list of conditions presumed to be associated with exposure to Agent Orange.

Wilkie indicated that VA would release its plan to expand the caregiver program in early March and indicated that his father is impacted by Agent Orange exposure so he is working hard to make it right.

MCLENNAN COUNTY – VETERAN SERVICES OFFICE

The county veteran services offices provides assistance, counsel and advocacy for veterans, spouses, widows and dependents, helping them to obtain state and federal veterans' benefits. The offices can help secure copies of DD214s, medals and certificates, and provide information on VA healthcare, service-connected claims, pensions, dependency indemnity claims, education, home loans, insurance, burial benefits and other veterans concerns. There is a county residence requirement to obtain service. The local contact is Steve Hernandez, phone number 254-297-7171; he is located at Veterans One Stop, 2010 LaSalle Avenue.

BILLS ON SURVIVOR BENEFIT INCREASE

Bills in both the House and Senate would increase the base amount of Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC), the benefit paid to survivors who lose their service member-spouse to a service-connected illness or injury.

The base amount of DIC -- currently \$1340 a month, tax-free -- is fixed for all survivors. There can be some adjustments to the amount for special circumstances. DIC increases each year via an inflation-based cost of living adjustment (COLA).

The House and Senate bills, both titled the Dependency and Indemnity Compensation Improvement Act, would increase the DIC amount to 55% of the compensation paid to veterans rated 100% disabled by the VA. These 100% disabled veterans now receive \$3,106 a month; a change to 55% of that compensation would result in \$1,708 a month for the survivor.

"This increase addresses a parity issue with other federal programs for these members of our military community," said Col. Dan Merry, USAF (Ret), MOAA's vice president of government relations. "Just as MOAA fought, successfully, for military survivors facing the unfair 'widows tax' offset, we will work to support this change in how this survivor benefit is calculated for DIC recipients."

The Senate bill (<u>S.1047</u>) was introduced and referred to the Committee on Veterans Affairs in April 2019. The House bill (<u>H.R. 3221</u>) was introduced and referred to the Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs in June 2019.

NATIONAL VIETNAM WAR VETERANS DAY, MARCH 29

The Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017 establishes the day as a national observance; however, it is not an official holiday in any part of the United States.

All across the United States, commemorative events like wreath-laying ceremonies, speeches, and luncheons are held to mark the occasion. Typical venues include the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington DC, war veteran medical facilities, and military cemeteries.

Vietnam War Veterans Day was first observed as a one-time occasion on March 29, 2012, when President Barack Obama issued a proclamation calling on "all Americans to observe this day

with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities."

The day was then introduced as an annual event in 2017 when President Donald Trump signed the Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017.

Lasting from 1955 to 1975, the Vietnam War engulfed the Southeast Asian country of Vietnam as well as its neighboring countries, Cambodia and Laos. It resulted in several million deaths, most of whom were Vietnamese civilians.

The conflict began during the 1950s when the struggle between the country's communist northern part and the anti-communist south escalated. The United States began its military involvement in an effort to back the South's effort to quell the communist onslaught, which, at the height of the Cold War, was feared to promote the spread of communist ideology and influence worldwide. During the long war, around 2.7 million served in Southeast Asia, about 58,000 of who were killed. The conflict ended in 1975 with the fall of Saigon to North Vietnam.

SECURE ACT

On December 20, 2019, a new bill known as the SECURE Act was signed into law. Here are a few key changes, which take effect on January 1, 2020.

- Through the end of the year 2019, individuals may not contribute to a traditional IRA if they are older than 70 1/2. That restriction is eliminated for all contributions made for tax year 2020 and beyond. (Roth IRA contributions have never been subject to age restrictions.)
- Currently, the age at which you must begin taking required distributions from your retirement plan is 70 1/2. That age will rise to 72 for all those who have not yet attained age 70 1/2 by December 31, 2019.
- The new law allows penalty-free distributions from retirement accounts for expenses related to the birth or adoption of a child. The lifetime distribution limit is \$5,000.
- The new law provides for disaster relief, allowing penalty-free distributions from retirement accounts (up to \$100,000) for expenses related to disasters that occurred after 2017 and before February 18, 2020.
- There are changes to on stretch IRA's. The official name of the law is the Setting Every

Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019.

Last year less than forty percent (40%) of the members in the HOT Chapter of MOAA participated in its "Freedom is Not Free"
