MOAA 2022 GOALS

- Sustain pay raises and adequate BAH for the troops and COLA pay raises for retirees.
- Ensure the Coast Guard, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and Public Health Service continue to receive pay during a government shutdown.
- Protect the value of the military health care benefit.
- Protect the Military Health System pharmacy benefit, and achieve flexibility in TRICARE pharmacy copays.
- Address barriers to accessing care within the Military Health System, including TRICARE coverage gaps and mental health care access challenges.
- Protect family support programs and ensure military-provided services (housing, PCS, child care, youth programs, financial counseling) are readily available and meet standards for quality and costs.
- Achieve equity of benefits, protections and administration support for Guard/Reserve members consistent with their active-duty counterparts.
- Sustain Veterans Health Administration (VHA) foundational missions and services.
- Reform the presumptive process to support veterans claiming service-connected disabilities for toxic exposures.
- Achieve concurrent receipt of serviceearned retirement pay and VA disability pay.
- Protect full military honors and burial at Arlington National Cemetery for those currently eligible.
- Improve survivors' benefits.
- Support a quality transition experience from active duty to veteran status for all service members.
- Recognize the pandemic continues to affect the lives of our service members.

MOAA MEMBERS AMONG NEW ASTRONAUT NASA CLASS

Two MOAA members will be among the 10 NASA recruits set to begin astronaut training in January 2022.

Maj. Marcos Berríos, USAF, and Lt. Cmdr. Jessica Wittner, USN, join a military-heavy field of candidates who could be a part of planned missions to the moon and Mars in coming years. Berríos, 37, has 110 combat missions and 1,300 hours of flight time in more than 21 airframes, per his NASA bio. The Puerto Rico native served as a test pilot and deployed to Camp Bastion, Afghanistan, as well as the Horn of Africa in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

Lt. Cmdr. Jessica Wittner, USN, 38, also worked as a test pilot after securing her commission via an enlisted-to-officer program. She served as a department head with the Vigilantes of Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 151 at the time of her selection. "I think initially when you get the phone call, it's instantly shocking," Wittner told YourCentralValley.com – a news outlet covering her hometown of Clovis, Calif. "I had to pinch myself a couple of times."

More than 12,000 people from all 50 states applied for consideration.

MOAA members have made recent space-travel news: Col. Shane Kimbrough, USA (Ret), splashed down off the Florida coast Nov. 8 after spending nearly 200 days in orbit, and Col. Doug Hurley, USMC (Ret), who commanded the first crewed SpaceX launch in 2020, announced his retirement from NASA in July.

VETERANS LEGISLATION SIGNED INTO LAW

In early December, President Biden signed into law four bills. The Protecting Moms Who Served Act of 2021 will structure VA's maternity care coordination programs to provide community maternity care providers with training and support for veterans' unique pregnancy and postpartum needs. The Hire Veteran Health Heroes Act of 2021 will create alternative pathways for veterans to attain gainful employment after leaving active duty. The Colonel John M. McHugh Tuition Fairness for Survivors Act of 2021 will finally close the loophole for survivors using their Chapter 35, Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA) tuition benefits and ensure institutions charge in-state tuition to these students. Lastly, S. 1031 will require a study on disparities associated with race and ethnicity with respect to certain benefits administered by VA.

GLOBAL WAR ON TERROR MEMORIAL

Congress created exceptions to the law Dec. 14 to authorize a choice spot on the National Mall for a Global War on Terror Memorial to honor those who served in the nation's longest conflict, which is symbolically bookended by the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks and the disastrous fall of Kabul, Afghanistan, in August.

The authorization was only the opening move in a 24-step process, including approvals from the National Capital Planning Commission, the U.S. Commission of Fine Arts, the National Park Service and other agencies before the monument can be built.

The foundation also will have to come up with a design to memorialize a war that was launched to avenge the worst attacks on American soil, rout "evildoers" and remake nations, but left many in the general public and veterans to question whether the price in blood and treasure was worth the effort.

Joint Chiefs Chairman Gen. Mark Milley, at a joint Pentagon press briefing with Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin on Sept. 1, acknowledged the doubts but said there was "one thing I am certain of. For any soldier, sailor, airman, Marine and their family, your service mattered."

The final design for the GWOT Memorial will come from an arts competition, but the foundation said the overriding theme is expected to avoid the why and how of the war to focus on what mattered in the service and sacrifice of troops and their families.

"The GWOT Memorial will be a lasting tribute to the courage and sacrifice of all who have served -- especially those who have made the ultimate sacrifice -- in the nation's longest ongoing conflict to protect our country, while inspiring all Americans to stand united behind those who continue to serve," the foundation said in a release.

The amendment authorized that a GWOT Memorial "shall be located within the Reserve," the core section of the 1.8-mile National Mall stretching from the Capitol to the Lincoln Memorial that now is home to the World War II Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and the Korean War Veterans Memorial. The Global War on Terrorism Memorial Foundation must come up with at least 75% of the projected \$50 million cost of the GWOT Memorial all through private donations -- before it can be built, but Jackman was confident that ground could be broken in 2024.

F-22 AIRCRAFT UPGRADE AND TEXAS

The Air Force has awarded Lockheed Martin a \$10.9 billion contract to modernize the f-22 Raptor fighter. If all contract options are exercised, the work being done in Fort Worth, should be finished by October 31. 2031.

The massive deal will cover up to a decade's worth of sustainment and modernization of the fifth-gen fighter, including, upgrades, enhancements and fixes to the Raptor. Lockheed will also provide logistics services and modernization hardware kit procurement.

HIGH ENERGY LASER TESTED

Amphibious transport dock ship USS Portland (LPD 27) conducted a high-energy laser weapon system demonstration, Dec. 14, while sailing in the Gulf of Aden. During the demonstration, the Solid State Laser – Technology Maturation Laser Weapons System Demonstrator (LWSD) Mark 2 MOD 0 aboard the Portland successfully engaged a static surface training target. Portland previously tested the LWSD in May 2020 when it successfully disabled a small unmanned aerial system while operating in the Pacific Ocean.

DFAS IRS TAX INFORMATION

Military retirees, former spouses, and annuitants should have access to their IRS Form 1099Rs via their myPay accounts, but those awaiting mail deliveries will need to wait a bit longer.

All tax statements mailed by the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) will be sent no later than Jan. 31, 2022, the service announced in a Dec. 13 statement.

Retirees and former spouses were to have access to their 1099Rs by Dec. 17, per the release, with annuitant 1099Rs available Dec. 21. Other key 2022 dates for myPay form delivery:

- Jan. 4: Navy Student Loan Repayment Program (SLRP) W-2
- Jan. 6: Reserve Army, Navy, Air Force, Space Force W-2
- Jan. 8: Army Non-Appropriated Fund (NAF) Employee W-2 (other service's NAF employees receive tax forms via their respective service)
- Jan. 15: Active/Reserve Marine Corps W-2
- Jan. 20: Federal Civilian Employee W-2/1095 (DoD/Non-DoD)
- Jan. 22: Army SLRP W-2; Savings Deposit Program (SDP) 1099INT
- Jan. 25: Active Army, Navy, Air Force, Space Force W-2
- Jan. 26: Travel Pay 1099INT
- Jan. 31: Military/Military Retiree IRS Form 1095; Travel/Miscellaneous W-2

Need a reissue of a previous year's tax form? Visit the DFAS website for information. Need to change your mailing address? DFAS recommends doing so via myPay, but retirees also can do so by a change-ticket form. Other problems with myPay or DFAS? Contact the service at (888) 332-7411 or visit the DFAS customer services website, which includes detailed contact information, myPay and other resources, and holiday hours for the DFAS Customer Care Centers.
