VETERANS HOME CARE BILL

A bill introduced to the House in February could improve health care services for veterans who have caregivers.

The Elizabeth Dole Home and Community Based Services for Veterans and Caregivers Act aim to improve and expand the current home and community health care services for disabled veterans being cared for through the VA's family caregiver program.

If passed by Congress and signed into law by President Joe Biden, H.R. 6823 would:

- Raise the cap from 65 percent to 100 percent on how much VA pays for veteran's home care.
- Establish a VA pilot program to address home health aide shortages.
- Provide respite care time off to caregivers of veterans enrolled with inhome care programs.
- Expand access to home and communitybased services for veterans living in territories of the U.S. and to veterans enrolled in the Indian Health Service or tribal health programs.

However, the bill is in the first steps of the legislative process and is now just starting to go through various committee reviews before it can then be presented to the House for a vote. It then would have to go to the Senate for consideration.

MOAA EARLY COMMENTS ON COLA 2023

The economic indicator responsible for setting the cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for military retirees, disabled veterans, Social Security recipients, and others has edged even closer to record-setting territory.

Frequent visitors to MOAA's COLA Watch page won't be surprised by this trend, but new figures point to an even larger adjustment in 2023 to combat ongoing inflation.

The March Consumer Price Index for Urban and Clerical Workers (CPI-W), a figure released in April, was 1.52% higher than the February number. It's the largest February-to-March jump for CPI-W since at least 1978, when the statistic underwent a major revision and name change.

While the figures determining the annual COLA won't be set until later in the year – a walkthrough on the math is available at MOAA.org/colawatch – predictions point to a major uptick from last year's 5.9% COLA. The Senior Citizens League, a nonpartisan advocacy group, predicted an 8.9% 2023 COLA increase based on the March data. That's up from the group's 7.6% estimate the previous month.

If that figure holds, it would be the thirdlargest COLA since 1975, behind an 11.2% increase in January 1982 and a 14.3% boost the previous year. No other increases topped 10%.

NEW DIRECTOR AT NOAA

Rear Admiral Nancy Hann was confirmed as the new Director of National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) in November 2021, which has a cadre of 329 officers.

VA ADD OF RESPIRATORY DISEASES FOR THOSE HAVING SERVED IN SOUTHWEST THEATER OF OPERATIONS

As part of President Biden's Unity Agenda commitment to support the nation's Veterans, the Department of Veterans Affairs is adding nine rare respiratory cancers to the list of presumed service-connected disabilities due to military environmental exposures to fine particulate matter.

The following list of rare respiratory cancers will be added to VA's regulations through an Interim Final Rule published in the Federal Register on April 26, 2022:

- Squamous cell carcinoma of the larynx.
- Squamous cell carcinoma of the trachea.
- Adenocarcinoma of the trachea.
- Salivary gland-type tumors of the trachea.
- Adenosquamous carcinoma of the lung.
- Large cell carcinoma of the lung.
- Salivary gland-type tumors of the lung.
- Sarcomatoid carcinoma of the lung.
- Typical and atypical carcinoid of the lung.

VA will begin processing disability compensation claims for Veterans who served any amount of time in the <u>Southwest Asia theater of</u> <u>operations</u> beginning Aug. 2, 1990, to the present, or Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, Syria or Djibouti beginning Sept. 19, 2001, to the present.

Any Veteran who has or had one of the listed cancers at any time during or after separation from military service may be eligible for disability compensation benefits. VA will contact impacted Veterans and survivors to inform them about their eligibility and will provide information on how to apply.

Veterans, survivors or dependents who had claims previously denied for any of these respiratory cancers are encouraged to file a supplemental claim for benefits. To apply for benefits, Veterans and survivors may visit VA.gov or call toll-free at 800-827-1000.

VA WARNING TO ALWAYS BE AWARE OF SCAMS

Veterans Affairs officials are warning about an uptick in scam attempts targeting veterans' pensions that could result in serious financial problems for elderly or infirm individuals. "Fraudsters are getting smarter, more deliberate and more engaged. They're getting better," said Charles Tapp II, chief financial for the Veterans Benefits Administration. "We are seeing a lot more instances where veterans particularly seniors — are getting fraudulent calls … So we certainly are making our senior veterans more aware about pension poaching."

Earlier this year, the Federal Trade Commission reported that about 2.8 million Americans filed fraud complaints in 2021, the most on record. The agency estimated that consumers lost more than \$5.8 billion to scams last year.

VA officials said older veterans with military pensions or other regular department payouts can be attractive targets for would-be-thieves. Pension theft can occur when an outside party — a stranger or someone known to a veteran, such as a caregiver convinces veterans to shift their payouts to a new bank account or a separate financial product (annuities or trusts, for example), preventing them from accessing the money.

Tapp said when veterans' bank accounts are changed without explanation; it triggers an internal check within VA to ensure that fraud is not occurring. But other theft schemes are more difficult to detect and may only be corrected after months of malfeasance have already occurred.

In a series of recent outreach efforts, department officials are reminding veterans that VA does not charge to process applications for benefits and services, and it is against the law for an outside group or attorney to charge claimants for preparing benefits applications

Tapp said if individuals are confused about available services or benefits, they can contact VA's National Call Center at 1-800-827-1000. If someone calls about veterans benefits and asks for personal information, the interaction is likely a scam.

FREE AT HOME COVID TESTS

If you already ordered four no-cost at-home from Covidtests.gov, now you can get four more at-home tests shipped at no charge.

Visit COVIDtest.gov again to place your second order. As before, just enter your name and mailing address (you can also give your e-mail address if you want status updates on your order).

If you have not yet ordered any at-home tests, you can get a total of 8 tests shipped to your home. You will have to place two separate orders – each order equals four tests.

Visit CDC.gov to learn when to test yourself, how to use an at-home test, and what your test results mean.
